



Specifically, an NSL issued by the FBI shall inform the recipient of the right to judicial review of the NSL pursuant to the procedures set forth in 18 U.S.C. § 3511(a). See <u>Doe v. Mukasey</u>, 549 F.3d 861 (2d Cir. 2008). An NSL issued by the FBI shall also inform the recipient of the right to judicial review of any nondisclosure requirement imposed in connection with the NSL. An NSL shall specifically advise that, if the recipient wishes to make a disclosure that is prohibited by the nondisclosure requirement, the recipient must notify the FBI within 10 calendar days of receipt of the NSL, in accordance with notification instructions set forth in the NSL. The NSL shall further advise that the Government will initiate judicial review proceedings within 30 days of receiving such a notification, and that the nondisclosure requirement will remain in effect unless and until there is a final court order holding that disclosure is permitted. If the recipient does not activate the Government-initiated judicial review by providing notice to the Government within 10 calendar days of receipt of the NSL, then the nondisclosure requirement will remain in effect, subject to the recipient's opportunity to make an annual challenge to the nondisclosure requirement as provided by 18 U.S.C. § 3511(b).

(U//FOUO) In any judicial review proceeding regarding a nondisclosure requirement imposed in connection with an NSL, the Government will bear the burden of persuading the district court that there is good reason to believe that disclosure may result in one or more of the enumerated harms set forth at 18 U.S.C. § 2709(c): a danger to the national security of the United States; interference with a criminal, counterterrorism, or counterintelligence investigation; interference with diplomatic relations; or danger to the life or physical safety of any person, that is related to an authorized investigation to protect against international terrorism or clandestine intelligence activities. The Government's certification that disclosure may result in one of these enumerated harms will not be treated as conclusive. Accordingly, the field office or FBIHQ Division that issued the NSL, in conjunction with OGC, shall coordinate with DOJ and the United States Attorney's Office to ensure that the Government's certification is sufficient to meet the Government's burden of proof.
