Dear Chairwoman Ramirez and FTC Commissioners:

Google played an April's Fools prank on Gmail users. It backfired.<sup>1</sup> Spectacularly.<sup>2</sup> It also appears to violate the 2011 consent order with the company that followed the rollout of Buzz.<sup>3</sup>

Information is personally identifiable when "an authorship relationship connects the individual to the information."<sup>4</sup> Google's "change" in the "service" modified information concerning individual Gmail users, constituting a "new or additional sharing . . . of the Google user's identified information" under the FTC order.<sup>5</sup>

What do you plan to do?<sup>6</sup>
