2 I know data collection has been a subject of this litigation and a lot of litigations. Currently the commission 3 4 has received publicly available data from 19 states and one county in Hawaii, which does things a little differently in 5 6 terms of how I collects record. Some states are still in the process of submitting data. Importantly, the commission has 7 8 not made any decisions with respect to next steps about that 9 data.

There are no plans for data collection other than what was already requested in the letters that Mr. Kobach sent that are referenced in the complaint. While there have been some preliminary discussions about data sharing with other agencies within the federal government, those discussions have not taken place recently and no decisions have been made about that. Importantly, again, no data has been shared.

Finally, there is no set ending for the commission other than what is set out in the executive order, which calls for the commission to end two years after May 11, 2017, so May 11, 2019, or one month after the commission submits a final report, wherever comes first.
